born in 1940. His birth place is in the Fukuoka Prefecture of Japan.

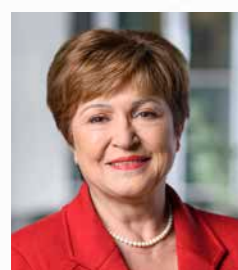
